Transition Planning: Three Goals

- Maintain and mainstream polio-essential functions after eradication has been certified, to protect a polio-free world
- Where feasible, desirable and appropriate, transition the capacities, processes and assets that the GPEI has created to support other health priorities
- 3. Capture and disseminate the lessons of polio eradication

Post Certification Strategy

Purpose: Define how a polio-free world will be sustained

Four goals:

Goal 1: Contain Polio Sources

Goal 2: Detect and Respond

Goal 3: Protect Populations

Goal 4: Manage Effectively and Monitor

- Ensure potential sources of poliovirus are properly controlled or removed
- Detect any poliovirus introduction and rapidly respond to prevent transmission
- Immunize current and future populations against unanticipated polio events
- Ensure polio is embedded in existing or develop new mechanisms to sustain the goals of polio post-certification

Development process: GPEI-led but highly inclusive; approximately one year

Relationship to transition planning (TMG):

 This strategic plan defines the future state (technical and programmatic) for a polio-free world. The TMG will coordinate the implementation of the Postcertification Strategy.




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16 Priority Countries

OBJECTIVES

- 1. Priority countries have transition plans defined by mid-2017
- 2. Remaining endemic priority countries have transition plans defined within 12 months of interrupting transmission
- 3. Transition plans effectively executed and monitored for quality during the GPEI ramp-down period **from 2017 onwards**

MAJOR AREAS OF WORK

- 1. Tools and guidance
- 2. Advocacy
- 3. Technical assistance
- 4. Coordination/information sharing

Country planning challenges



- 1. Securing **GOVERNMENT OWNERSHIP** particularly in presence of insecurity, instability, competing priorities
- Communicating that GPEI funding **DECREASES** are a **REALITY** – starting in 2017
- 3. INTEGRATION into existing country planning processes
 - National Health Sector Strategic Plan development
 - Global Health Security/International Health Regulations Joint External Evaluations
 - World Bank country health assessments
 - Gavi Joint Appraisals





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WHO Polio Transition Planning



- Polio Transition Steering Committee established by the Director General, co-chaired by: Dr Ian Smith, Executive Director, Director General's Office; Dr Hans Troedsson, Assistant Director-General, General Management
- Updated analysis of WHO's Human Resources funded by GPEI prepared for January 2017 Executive Board

UNICEF Polio Transition Planning

- Transition Manger embedded within Immunization Team
- 2017-2030 Immunization Strategic Plan details integration of polio lessons learned and processes
- Agency wide mapping of polio funded and immunization funded positions for risk mitigation completed by Q1 2017





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Immunization



- Formal GPEI-Gavi collaboration
 - Afghanistan, Chad, DR Congo, Ethiopia, India, Myanmar,
 Nigeria, Pakistan, Somalia, and South Sudan
 - GPEI asset mapping data into Joint Appraisals and funding application processes
- Risks and opportunity of polio transition recognised, and action recommended, in
 - Global Vaccine Action Plan (GVAP) mid-term review
 - Measles & Rubella Global Strategic Plan mid-term review



Global Health Security: Pakistan Joint External Evaluation



GPEI-funded assets and capabilities, particularly:

- Surveillance system
- Collaboration between public health program and police/military

...form a substantial part of the recommendations for strengthening delivery of national requirements under the International Health Regulations

Transition IMB Terms of Reference



Six-monthly:

- 1) monitor planning & implementation in priority countries
- 2) evaluate work of governments and partners (including, but not limited to, the core partners of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative)
- 3) comment on contribution of other stakeholders or programs
- 4) comment on the degree to which all crucial stakeholders are being successfully engaged

The Transition IMB will also act as a neutral convenor, to engage additional parties and to facilitate and guide interactions between parties.
