FUNDING UPDATE

New Zealand disbursed 2 million New Zealand dollars to WHO to support the 2018/2019 cVDPV outbreak response in Papua New Guinea. This funding is in addition to global funds pledged in 2017 through Rotary International.

UNICEF is grateful to the **United Nations Foundation** for contributing US\$ 1 490 239 to support vaccine procurement in Pakistan, which will support critical vaccine purchase, delivery and supply to vaccinate Pakistani children.
