IMPROVED COVERAGE AND COORDINATION IN PAKISTAN AND AFGHANISTAN

The Pakistan and Afghanistan Technical Advisory Groups (TAG) met in March to review country-specific progress toward polio eradication and to address remaining challenges. The TAGs commended the Pakistan and Afghanistan teams for their improved immunization coverage and inter-country coordination, encouraging them to increase this cooperation and to focus on reaching high-risk mobile populations.
