World Health Assembly Highlights Polio Eradication Efforts

At the end of May, representatives from 194 countries gathered in Geneva, Switzerland, for the annual World Health Assembly. This year, countries elected a new Director-General of the World Health Organization, Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus from Ethiopia. At the session on polio eradication, discussions focused on halting transmission in endemic countries and transitioning polio resources to address other health challenges. [Read more]
