PAKISTAN POLIO UPDATE




The second country-wide immunization campaign during the current low season for poliovirus transmission took place from 20-23 November 2017 in Pakistan. More than 38 million children under 5 years of age were vaccinated by a team of almost 260,000 dedicated frontline workers.

In November 2017, Pakistan reported three new polio cases, bringing the total national case count so far this year to eight, compared to 19 this time last year (corresponding to 58% reduction). Two of the three new cases, including one from Karachi and one from Killa Abdullah district in Baluchistan, belong to Pakistan's "core polio reservoirs", while the third case is from Zhob district in Baluchistan. The responses to all of these cases are currently underway, with the objective of protecting other children in the community and stopping the virus circulation.


The month of November 2017 was also marked by the meetings of two independent monitoring and advisory bodies on polio eradication including the Independent Monitoring Board (IMB), whose meeting was held in London from 31 October - 1 November 2017, and the Technical Advisory Group (TAG) who met in Islamabad from 30 November - 1 December 2017.

The TAG recognized the high level of Government commitment and the progress made to date, while reminding the programme of the existing gaps and concluding that simultaneous high-quality campaigns need to take place across the Pakistan-Afghanistan epidemiological block to stop the virus transmission. In its 15th report entitled "Every Last Hiding Place", the IMB commended the dedication and hard work of leaders and staff of the polio programme, while emphasizing on continuing action by the governments of Pakistan and Afghanistan to work closely together to secure strong cross-border arrangements for anti-polio vaccination. With the three newly reported cases from Pakistan and the most recent case from Afghanistan's Shah Wali Kot district in Kandahar province, the total number of polio cases in the Pakistan-Afghanistan epidemiological block so far this year is 20, compared to 37 this time last year.





High sensitivity of the surveillance system enables the programme to detect the virus and respond quickly.




Proportion of positive environmental samples 53 environmental detection sites = largest polio environmental footprint in the world
