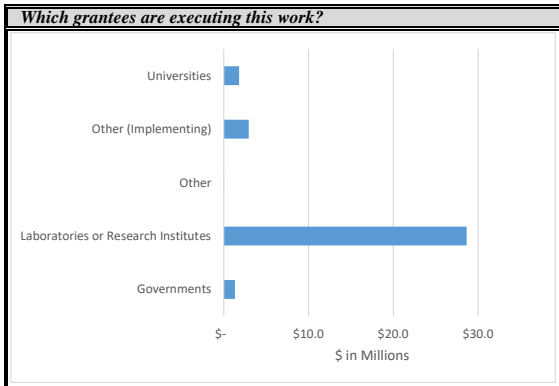
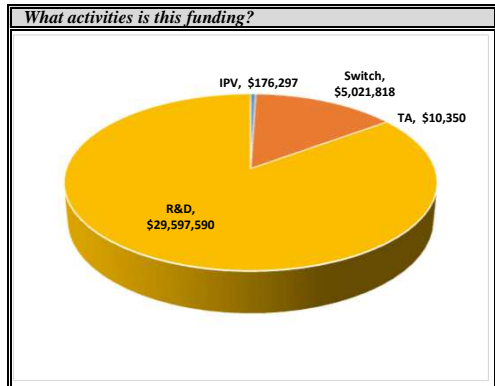
### Objective 1 Poliovirus Detection and Interruption



**What is the programmatic purpose/intended outcome of the contributions?**

- Support Emergency Operations Centers (EOCs) in Pakistan, Afghanistan, and Nigeria.
- Buydown vaccines for routine immunization and support innovative strategies to promote government commitments to polio activities.
- Provide technical support to improve program management, campaign quality, surveillance and outbreak response in high-risk countries.
- Continue independent campaign monitoring in Pakistan to identify opportunities to reduce the number of missed children and implement localized tactics and strategies to address those opportunities.
- Support surveillance strengthening using mobile and GIS technology and increasing community based surveillance in hard to reach populations.

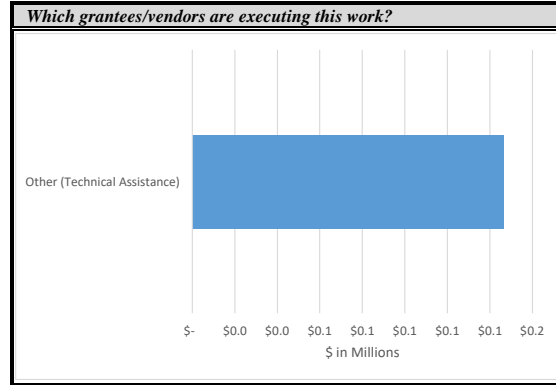
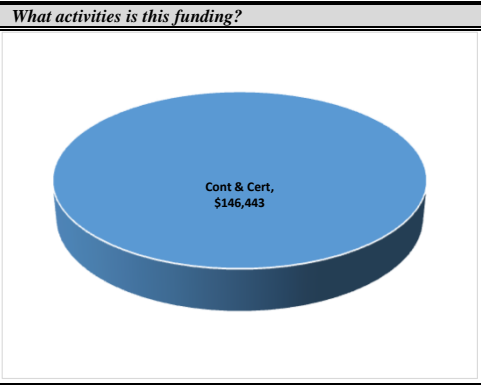
### Objective 2 Immunization Systems Strengthening and OPV Withdrawal

- Support accelerated development of nOPV products.
- Develop an antiviral to mitigate the risk of long-term viral shedding by immunodeficient individuals.

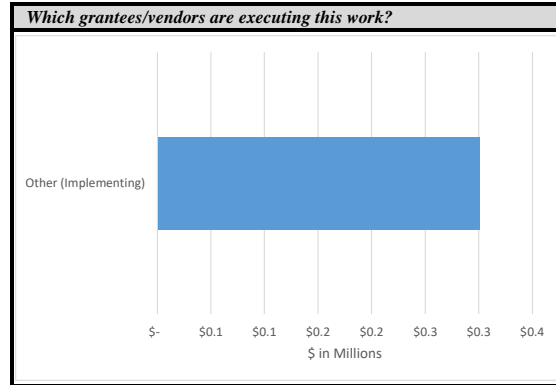
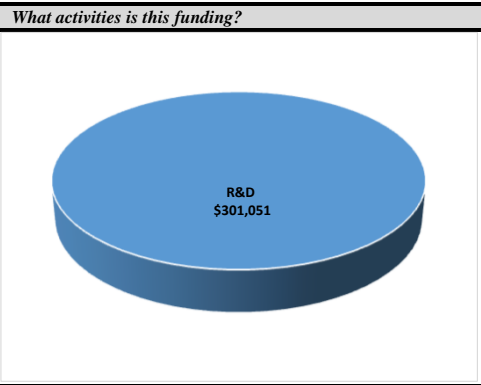
**Objective 3 Containment & Certification**

**Objective 4 Transition Planning**

 To perform complementary work to WHO and UNICEF designed to speed up the achievement and maintenance of global polio eradication.

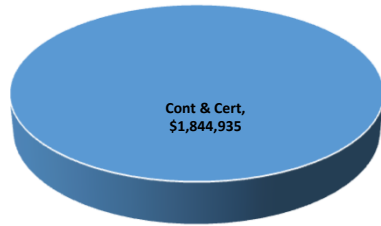

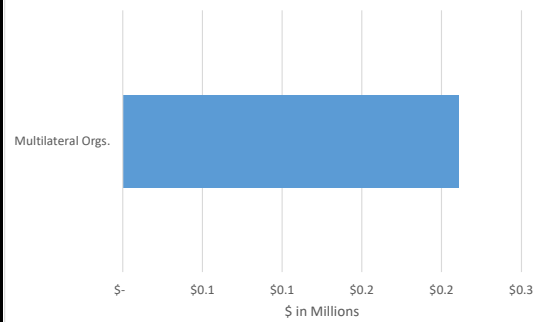
To prepare the Polio Laboratory Network for the certification of polio eradication and the containment of polio samples.
