Dear polio eradication supporter,

Amidst a challenging geopolitical and climatic backdrop in 2023, the Global Polio Eradication Initiative <u>continued to lay the groundwork</u> for a polio-free world. As we enter 2024, we do so with complete focus and the celebration of a groundbreaking milestone – the <u>WHO Prequalification</u> of the next-generation polio vaccine, nOPV2. Approximately 1 billion doses of nOPV2 have already been administered across 35 countries, and now with its final stamp of regulatory approval, more countries will be able to access and use this vaccine, protecting children from polio's devastating consequences. As the first-ever vaccine to move from WHO's Emergency Use Listing to Prequalification, nOPV2 continues to pave the way for other life-saving innovations. With this impactful news, the GPEI is starting 2024 strong, and remains confident that through continued dedication we can make the dream of a polio-free world a reality.

The fight to stop variant poliovirus



In 2021, cases of variant poliovirus surged in Nigeria, paralyzing 418 children in 12 months. Determined to stop the spread and protect children across the country, Nigeria became a pioneer in rolling out nOPV2—and with remarkable results. Since nOPV2 rollout began, the country has achieved an 85% reduction in cases from the 2021 peak, and the virus' genetic diversity is falling. On 5 December, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and the French Development Agency (AFD) announced an exciting new partnership to aid polio eradication efforts, beginning with a loan of up to €55 million from AFD to support polio vaccination and health system resilience in Pakistan.
