Polio vaccination campaigns begin in Gaza



Following the recent environmental detections and paralytic case of variant polio in Gaza, the World Health Organization, UNICEF and the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine

Refugees are coordinating a vaccination campaign with the Palestinian Ministry of Health to prevent further transmission of the disease. An agreement has been reached for three separate, zoned three-day pauses in fighting in Gaza to allow for the vaccination of 640 000 children against polio. The vaccination campaign launched last weekend, and on day one, 513 teams reached 86 683 children with polio vaccines across 143 sites. While this campaign will provide some protection, the risk of an outbreak spreading is extremely high if the devastation to Gaza's infrastructure caused by the ongoing conflict continues. [More]

DONOR UPDATES

UNICEF and WHO extend their gratitude to His Highness Sheikh Mohamed Bin Zayed Al Nahyan, President of the **United Arab Emirates**, for the generous new pledge of US\$ 5 million to support the polio response efforts in Gaza and for the additional contribution of US\$ 19 million to ensure that other countries globally are able to conduct polio vaccination campaigns to protect their children and contribute to a polio-free world.

WHO would also like to thank the Government of the **United Arab Emirates** for its contribution of US\$ 6.3 million to the **UAE Pakistan Assistance Programme (UAE PAP)** to support polio vaccination campaigns in Pakistan. With this funding, UAE PAP's total contribution in 2024 is more than US\$ 10 million.

UNICEF and WHO would like to extend their gratitude to the **European Investment Bank** (EIB) for the contribution of €169 million, of which €67.6 million will support vaccine procurement and €101.4 million will support outbreak response activities in countries. This is the second disbursement of an innovative financing partnership with the EIB, the **European Commission** and the **Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation** that aims to invest €500 million in support of the GPEI.

UNICEF acknowledges the **United States Agency for International Development (USAID)** for their continued support and contribution of US\$ 2.3 million to global polio eradication efforts. This longstanding partnership has significantly contributed to polio eradication and broader immunization and health achievements globally.






