This month, in Abu Dhabi, global leaders pledged [US\\$ 1.9 billion](#) to end polio and protect children worldwide. The global pledging event, 'Investing in Humanity: United to End Polio' was hosted by the Mohamed bin Zayed Foundation for Humanity in partnership with the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI). The commitment includes US\$ 1.2 billion from the [Gates Foundation](#), US\$ 140 million from the Mohamed bin Zayed Foundation for Humanity, US\$ 450 million from Rotary International, and US \$100 million from [Bloomberg Philanthropies](#). Donors including Germany, Japan, and the Islamic Food and Nutrition Council of America, also contributed significant commitments. This historic investment will help reach millions of children with life-saving vaccines and strengthen health systems, moving us one step-closer to a polio-free world. As we reflect on [progress throughout 2025](#) and look ahead to 2026, it is clear that continued partnership remains essential to deliver a polio-free future.

GPEI and Gavi Boards Convene in Second Joint Session

The boards of Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance, and the GPEI convened for their second joint session to strengthen collaboration and accelerate progress toward shared goals: reaching zero-dose and under-immunized children with lifesaving vaccines and ending polio worldwide. Discussions focused on enhancing integration efforts during and outside of campaigns, and country representatives from Nigeria and Pakistan shared updates on how integrated vaccination is helping strengthen routine immunization systems while responding to polio outbreaks in some of the world's most challenging operating environments. Protecting Children in Afghanistan

In Afghanistan, health workers are introducing innovative strategies to reach more children stop virus transmission faster. From August to October 2025, Afghanistan launched a three-phase fractional Inactivated Polio Vaccine (fIPV) campaign across the eastern region, aiming to protect more than 1.2 million children. Children received both the fractional IPV dose and the oral vaccine – two tools working together to help communities build stronger, longer-lasting protection. [\[More\]](#)
