Dear polio eradication supporter,

Vaccinators in several countries conducted polio immunization activities this month, following Global Polio Eradication Initiative recommendations for safe campaign resumption. All campaigns were implemented in line with the latest WHO guidance to protect both vaccinators and children amid the pandemic. Alongside their efforts to end polio, health workers continued through July to <u>deliver lifesaving messages</u> on COVID-19 to the communities they serve.
